# Mathieu Miron Wins First Two Races During the First Nissan Sentra Cup in the United States!

Lime Rock Circuit in Connecticut Hosted Races 5 and 6 of the 2024 Nissan Sentra Cup Season; Valérie Limoges Mid-Season Champion The Nissan Sentra Cup had its debut in the United States this weekend, with Races 5 and 6 of the 2024 season presented at Lime Rock Park Circuit in Connecticut. The event was part of the Lime Rock SpeedTour, the largest annual event on the historic New England racetrack. The two-day event

was met with sun, warm weather, along with some rain, and thousands of spectators at the edge of the track. Both Nissan Sentra Cup races were won by Mathieu Miron, his first two victories in the series.

The hierarchy set in place at the start of the season was shaken up beginning with the free practice on Friday. In qualifying, Mathieu Miron surprised the favourites, taking pole position for both races. Alexandre Fortin, the defending champion, Nicolas Barrette, Simon Vincent and Jean-François Couture completed the Top 5. For Couture, it was his best qualifying since his debut in 2023. Valérie Limoges completed the top six, identical for both qualifying.

With the summer sun shining down on the magnificent 2.4 km natural track, the Nissan Sentra Cup competitors presented their first event late Saturday morning. A group of five drivers battled for the victory the entire race, from beginning to end. Mathieu Miron resisted pressure from his competitors perfectly, preventing others from breaking the hierarchy formed from the beginning. The driver of the 191 Motorsport team won by four seconds, in front of Alexandre Fortin. Nicolas Barrette completed the podium, ahead of Simon Vincent, Valérie Limoges, Éric Chaput, Jean-François Couture, Raphaël St-Pierre, Nicolas Lévesque and Jean Audet.


"It's by coming to drive in such an event that we measure how popular and loved motorsport is in the United States. As a driver, I really liked it, not only because I won the race but because it was truly unique and it's incredible visibility for the Nissan Sentra Cup and us, as drivers," mentioned Mathieu Miron, the first driver to win the Cup in the United States.





The second race in the afternoon took place on a drying track after a brief but intense downpour. While Alexandre Fortin was able to take the lead for a few moments, Mathieu Miron regained control and raced towards another victory. The battle for second place enlivened the rest of the race, with Fortin holding off Valérie Limoges, Nicolas Barrette and Simon Vincent until the end. Nicolas Lévesque completed the Top 6 ahead of Éric Chaput, Jean Audet, Sylvain Ouellet and Jean-François Couture. The race ended under yellow flags due to Raphaël St-Pierre's off course. He was in sixth place with three laps to go.

"This was an extremely positive experience for all our competitors, our fans and Nissan Canada. We were particularly well received at Lime Rock, the atmosphere of this event was exceptional, with thousands of enthusiasts on site and we will do everything we can to come back next year." The media impact also perfectly met our expectations, it is a total success for the debut of the Nissan Sentra Cup in the United States" confides promoter Jacques Deshaies.

### PAUL NEWMAN'S HISTORIC RACEWAY

Lime Rock Park, established in 1957, has always been a preferred track for New England drivers. One of the most famous of them, undoubtedly, was the late actor Paul Newman, who passed away in 2008 and owned a home near the track. A true motorsport enthusiast, Newman was an excellent driver and Lime Rock was his home track. He used to race and drive his classic cars



for fun, including multiple Nissans. Most notably, a 280ZX V8 twin turbo with 933 hp! Lime Rock permanently honours the memory of the American actor and driver with a straight line bearing his name and paintings in the media center and VIP areas.

#### LEARNING THE TRACK THROUGH A RACE SIMULATOR...

While the Lime Rock track was a new experience for all the drivers in the series except Valérie Limoges, who competed in an Endurance race in 2006, some of them practised with VR instead. Mathieu Miron, for example, admitted to having driven for at least 300 hours on a simulator, through the IRacing platform. Jean-François Couture (pictured here) also practised online using Sentra settings for 4 to 6 hours per week over the last eight months, totalling about 200 hours! The settings obtained were then transferred to his Nissan Sentra race car, helping to immediately familiarize him with the American track.



## A NISSAN CUP DRIVER IN TIMES SQUARE!

Renowned for its proximity to New York City, Lime Rock Park was the perfect excuse for Nicolas Barrette to visit the American city with his girlfriend the day before the practices and qualifying sessions. A visit to New York must have aided the Nissan Sentra Cup driver who had two superb races and is a 2024 title contender with Valérie Limoges and Alexandre Fortin.

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


## Postcard from the Lime Rock SpeedTour




### From the Nissan Sentra Cup to International Series...

Since 2015, the Nissan Micra, and later the Sentra Cup, have introduced dozens of new drivers to the joys of motorsport on Canadian tracks. Some of these drivers have advanced their careers to international championships. Aside from the GT Academy drivers mentioned in our previous edition, notable figures include Marco Signoretti, who became champion in 2019 and later competed at the famed Daytona International Speedway in an IMSA **Endurance event supporting the** renowned 24 Hours. This season, Jesse Webb and Jesse Lazare can be found in this championship, while Stefan Rzadzinski, Demi Chalkias, Aaron Povoledo, and Mike Ogren are competing in various SRO America championships, and Austin Riley in prototype Radical North America series.



Jesse Lazare started in the Nissan Micra Cup in 2018 before returning to compete for the title against Kevin King in 2020 and 2021, which was the first season of the Sentra Cup. Both times, he finished as vice-champion, securing 3 victories and 5 pole positions in 2020, then 2 victories and 7 pole positions in 2021. What memories does he have of his time in the Nissan Cup? "Looking back at my two full seasons in the Nissan Sentra Cup, I can truly say it was a remarkable experience," he says.

For him, the best moment was undoubtedly "that this series was focused on close racing. Every race was a battle, and it was a pleasure to race wheel to wheel with the other drivers." The Québec driver has since become a standout in the IMSA Michelin Pilot



Challenge series. He currently drives a McLaren Artura GT4 with Motorsports In Action (MIA), a long-time partner of the Nissan Cup, with which he won the 2023 season finale and the race at Laguna Seca, California, this past spring.

In 2018, American Mike Ogren finished seventh in the championship, achieving ten Top 10 finishes in 12 races (with a best result of 4<sup>th</sup> place), making him an expert at being consistent during his only season in the series. At the SRO events, although he is not

racing this season, he is one of the official drivers providing hot laps to guests between official sessions.

Ontario native Demi
Chalkias achieved a Top
12 finish in her first race
in the series back in 2019.
She later competed in GT
Ontario and SportsCar
Canada (SCCC) before
participating in the
highly sought-after GT4
America series in the
United States this season,
driving a MercedesAMG GT4. While she was

no stranger to road racing when she joined the Nissan Micra Cup, she admits that her time in the series "was an incredible opportunity and probably one of the best spec series in Canada to compete in. The Nissan Micra Series really teaches you a lot about extracting everything out of a car, developing good race craft, and knowing when to make a pass. Making calculated moves has definitely helped me in my professional career now in the Pirelli GT4 America Series and SRO, where we are always searching for the last bit of performance from the car.

"Every time we're out on the track, we are trying to find ways to go faster. With large fields of GT4 cars, we really have to have good race craft to compete at this level. I'd say the Nissan Micra Series is one of the best series to learn all of the foundations you need to go pro racing," she added.

Jesse Webb made a significant impact in 2021, during the inaugural season of the Nissan Sentra

Cup. He claimed the Rookie of the year award thanks to his third place in the championship that he achieved with 4 podiums, 1 pole position, and a stellar victory at the Canadian Tire Motorsport Park on September 5, 2018. The young British Columbia driver was a shining example of the new Sentra's reliability that year, finishing all his races in the Top 10. His time in the series gave him the media boost needed to aim to race in the United States. In 2024, Jesse is also racing in IMSA, driving a Mercedes-AMG GT4.

Albertan Stefan Rzadzinski took several victories in Micra before returning to drive, for fun, in a Sentra at the 2022 Grand Prix du Canada. Rzadzinski was one of the big players in the early seasons, even

fighting for the championship in 2015. This year, he competed in a few races in GT4 America series, in a Nissan Z NISMO GT4.

In 2017, the series welcomed Austin Riley, the first Nissan Cup driver on the spectrum to line up on the grid... and the first to earn a podium finish a year later at Canadian Tire Motorsport Park, in 2018. Austin has since gone on to have a successful career in Radical prototypes, racking up multiple victories. This season, he's competing in the Radical North America Championship.

Finally, Aaron Povoledo raced in the Nissan Micra Cup in 2016, achieving great success in two rounds at the Canadian Tire Motorsport Park (finishing 10<sup>th</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>). This year, he competes in the highly competitive GT World Challenge America series, driving a Mercedes-AMG GT3. He is also a driving instructor and a former Player's Driver Development Program participant.



Rookie of the year in the series in 2021, Jesse Webb is now competing in IMSA GT4.


